In an effort to continue providing coffee and tea but at a reasonable price, and after lots of research, we have installed a commercial Keurig machine. Coffee and Tea pods are available at the front desk for .50¢/pod. Just let us know if you would like coffee or tea, caffeinated or decaf. The Keurig machine is located at the back of the dining room on a table in front of the kitchen. There are directions on how to use the machine printed on the table beside it. If you should have any questions or need assistance, we are happy to help.

The program is designed to help you take control of your life, to live a happy, healthy, and independent lifestyle. **REAP** provides education to help you better understand and deal with the many life changes you might encounter. **REAP** counselors are available by phone or by appointment to provide you or your loved ones with information and resources on how to deal with life changes including loss, grief, and other personal concerns. **Eligibility**

- NH residents 60 years old or older,
- Resident of a NH Senior Housing site, or
- Caregivers or family members of an older adult living in NH

Exceptions: Permanent residents of long term care facilities and active clients of a NH Community Mental Health Center are not eligible for the REAP program.
